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

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The city of Cottonwood is located in Yavapai County, Arizona approximately 103 miles north of Phoenix, 54 miles east of Prescott and 48 miles south of Flagstaff. Cottonwood is in the "Heart of the Verde Valley Wine Country" and is the economic hub of the Verde Valley communities which include Sedona, Clarkdale, Jerome, Camp Verde and many unincorporated communities. Cottonwood and the Verde Valley communities in eastern Yavapai County have experienced substantial population growth over the last 15 years with the current population exceeding 65,000.

The Arizona Department of Transportation currently is widening State Route 260 east of Cottonwood between Thousand Trails Road and Interstate-17. This project is the final step in transforming SR 260 into a continuous four-lane divided highway between the I-17 / SR 260 junction and Cottonwood to improve traffic flow and promote commercial and residential development for the Greater Verde Valley area.

Cottonwood's largest employer is Verde Valley Medical Center with four locations throughout the Verde Valley. More than 800 professional and support staff are employed at VVMC with nearly 100 physicians representing 25 medical specialities. The Verde Valley campus of Yavapai College in 2013 broke ground on the Southwest Wine Center which is arguably the state's foremost educational research facility for the burgeoning vineyard and wine industry in Arizona.

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
Cottonwood has seen Phoenix and other local developers and investment groups arrive to develop new master planned communities. Brookfield Communities Verde Santa Fe and Del Webb's Cottonwood Ranch are two good examples of large developments that have helped bolster the area's population the last couple decades. Currently there are several residential developments underway within a one mile radius of the property. The Vineyards at Cottonwood is anticipated to start construction in 2017 on a 550 multi and single family development. Mesquite Hills is a 425 single family unit development that is underway. Within a five mile radius of the property are even more developments being planned and under construction such as Mountain Gate in Clarkdale with over 600 multi and single family units and adjoining Verde Santa Fe is the 89A & Vine development with a proposed 2,050 homes.

Cottonwood's Historic Old Town is a vibrant thriving corridor just 1/2 mile northeast of the property. Old Town is known for its Main Street with over 60 businesses that attract visitors and support locals. Events throughout the year are held in Old Town such as the Thunder Valley Rally, art walk, chocolate and wine tasting events. Old Town has transformed into a culinary hot spot and it's a destination for wine lovers.






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Cottonwood has experienced and will continue to see strong population growth. This population growth will continue to spur demand for commercial uses. The Verde Valley communities are closely tied together with Cottonwood being at the center and economic hub. The chart at right shows Cottonwood's job count and wage correlation.

While Old Town itself is becoming a tourist destination, the Verde Valley is home to two of the top three tourist destinations in Arizona in Jerome and Sedona. Highway 89A ties these two communities together which many tourists from the Phoenix Metro area can make quick day or weekend trips.

Jerome is a once thriving 19th-century mining town which has transformed into a haven of artist studios, restaurants, shops, eclectic inns and B&Bs. The mile-high mountainside art town now has over 1 million people visit each year.
